Updates

The Values Act is still in-progress, but not yet passed. However, our state legislators have still not scheduled the bill for hearings which would lead to a vote. On August 3, WotS members attended a planning meeting on how to get the Values Act passed during the "lame duck" session, the period between the November elections and the end of this year, also known as the «lame duck» session.

Registry

In the House of Representatives it is known as HR1511, and in the Senate S2606. Rep. Zoe Lofgren is the sponsor of HR1511, and it currently has 61 cosponsors (including Rep. Bonnie Watson Coleman, who represents Plainfield). Senator Alex Padilla is the sponsor of S2606, which counts with all of the same sponsors as last year, including NJ's own Sen. Booker. This month WotS plans to schedule meetings, hold roundtables, and attend public events to push for support of Registry.

DED FOR COLOMBIA

A WotS delegation travelled to Washington, DC on **July 20** to call for DED for Colombia; as WotS still continues to work for a TPS designation for Guatemala, and re-designations for El Salvador, Honduras, and Nicaragua.

A large rally and march was held in Trenton on **June 15**, to demand the NJ Domestic Workers Bill of Rights; we will continue to work with our partners to get this bill passed too, within 2023.



Townhalls YOUR PARTICIPATION IS IMPORTANT!!

A Townhall meeting is a gathering intended to give the community an opportunity to ask questions and make comments to the representatives. The meetings are usually scheduled in 2 sections: the representative talks about their duties, and there is also an open floor for questions from the constituents.

The opportunity to interact directly with your representative and make a good impression is essential for the visibility of your community; direct contact is the most influential method of communication with government officials.
