## Housing, A Local Campaign

Wind of the Spirit has been fighting to keep Dover, NJ from becoming a town similar to Morristown and others; where they sell the town to developers who build big luxuries apartments, with the purpose of avoiding having to pay taxes for around 30 years. These are taxes that could, very well, be going towards our children's schools. This is an excellent business for them, but this affects middle class and immigrant population. This is causing for rents to increase; for landlords to kick people out in order to fix their properties with the purpose of renting them at a higher price, where the only way of paying is if you earn a just salary.

In Dover, they have been building various luxury apartments and they want to build more; this situation, by approving new construction work, does not leave space por accesible housing.

With the support of members from Dover, we have been able to obtain 9-10% of accesible housing in this new construction. However, as an organization, we are still fighting for the town to pass a rent control and Inclusionary Zoning (IZ) ordinance, as well as other proposals, which Dover already knows about thanks to a letter we sent and with the support of Dover residents who helped out with 300 signatures.

These measures will increase housing supply by eliminating obsolete and unnecessary ordinances that prohibit the construction of expensive houses and multi-family households. These measures will increas general safety for all residents, therefore, the quantity of residents who live in super populated guest houses, and those who are subletting without any authorization or supervision will decrease.

## Values Act, A State Campaign, NJ

The *Values Act* is one of the most important bills for us immigrants, especially those of us who are or have loved ones without citizenship (undocumented). Since **2018**, through the Immigrant Confidence Directive, which is temporary, we have managed to stop the police from cooperating with ICE (immigration). This Law would strengthen it and make it a Law, if it manages to pass, it would be permanent. In that case, neither the police, nor agencies, nor schools could ask for documents that reveal the immigration status of an individual. They would be just doing their job, as they have done since **2018**, instead of cooperating with ICE.

## The Struggle Continues

Wind of the Spirit (WotS) with the help and support of it's active members and other organizations such as, NJ Immigrant Justice Alliance (NJAIJ), we have been working in favor of this this bill. On October 27, 2022 we were at the State House in Trenton, New Jersey in a lobbying action, in other words, we went with the purpose of educating legislators on the Values Act. For us and for our community, it is important for our representatives to support and vote in favor of this bill, therefore, WE MAKE A CALL FOR YOU TO JOIN THIS CAUSE AS WELL! If you have a testimony about something you went through with immigration in the past, if any be loved ones or Friends went through something similar, their story is important to this campaign! If you have not gone through anything with immigration, but are an immigrant, we need your support!



# Updates

## Registry

Want to know what's going on with immigration? Without a path to citizenship for Non-Citizens (Undocumented), at *Wind of the Spirit* we are working on a path to residency and Citizenship through the Registry.



We are holding informational and educational forums about Registry and on immigration updates. The first was held on Thursday, October 27, 2022, in Madison, New Jersey, and then on Sunday, October 30, 2022, in Dover. Additionally, we will have a forum in Morristown on November 6, 2022, and a final forum in Plainfield on November 12.



On October 17, 2022 women of the Domestic Wokers group mobilized in Trenton, New Jersey in order to move forward with the proposal for the Bill of Rights for Domestic Workers (A822). This bill comes out of the government committee state and local assembly. Therefore, visits were made to current Legislators and Assembly Members, in order to demand rights and better working conditions for the Domestic Workers campaign.



The **Domestic Workers** Committee meets every two weeks in different locations such as **Madison**, **Dover**, **Plainfield** and will soon reopen in **Morristown**. We invite the community to get to know this group and support its cause.

## OSHA 30 Certification

On October 16, 2022, 28 immigrants who received training in OSHA 30 construction sector were certified. The training was held at the Catholic Charities headquarters in Yonkers, New York. The importance of the program highlights the knowledge that is provided to workers, so that they can perform a job safely, and at the same time, identify the rights and responsibilities that they have to keep in mind when performing their job.

# Tickborne Illness Project

Outdoor and migrant workers are populations that often experience inequities in health and in access to medical resources. In partnership with the *National Center for Farmworker Health*, we worked in Morris County, collecting data for the project "*Tick-Borne Disease Awareness and Support Needs for Outdoor Workers (TIKSNOW)*." We come together to publicize the purpose of this project, which recognizes that: Lyme disease is the most common vector-borne disease in the US.

The objectives of the project are: (1) To evaluate the risk of exposure and contagion of diseases spread by ticks in outdoor workers, especially workers in the agricultural, construction and gardening sectors; (2) Learn about the knowledge, attitudes, and practices in this population regarding the protection and prevention of tick bites; and (3) Evaluate the possible acceptability of a vaccine to prevent Lyme disease.

## We Make History



The "We Make History" workshop focuses on claiming the role of domestic workers and trace, in a Timeline, the evolution and the origin of domestic work. This workshop seeks to bring together women in order to provide a space for conversation, education, and empowerment. In about 17 workshops that last about 6 months or so, the group talks about: slavery, white supremacy, patriarchy, capitalism, colonialism, power, among other topics. The workshop teaches us that this fight is still going on, for the rights of domestic workers, we demand guarantees such as: rights to a pension, a fair salary, sick days, among other benefits. 
